

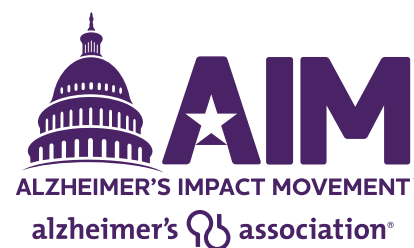

Today, Alzheimer's costs the country \$259 billion a year.

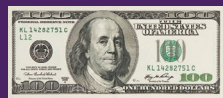

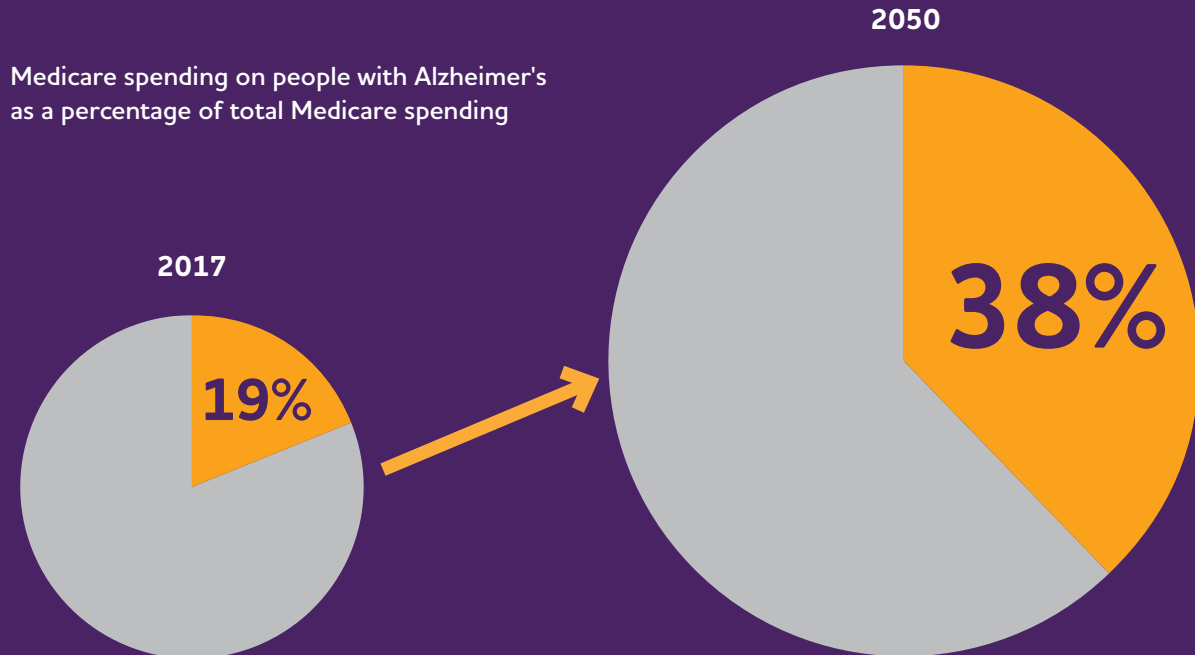
