Heather Snyder, PhD



Dr. Snyder is Director of Medical and Scientific Operations for the Alzheimer's Association and assists with oversight of the [International Research Grant Program](#), the world's largest nonprofit initiative to advance Alzheimer's research. She also collaborates with the National Institute on Aging (NIA) to conduct an ongoing comprehensive portfolio analysis of Alzheimer's Association-supported research.

Dr. Snyder plays a key supporting role in other Alzheimer's Association science activities, including the Association's leadership of the [World Wide Alzheimer's Disease Neuroimaging Initiative \(WW-ADNI\)](#); the Alzheimer's Association Quality Control Program for CSF Biomarkers; its Everyday Technologies for Alzheimer's Care (ETAC) grant partnership with Intel Corporation; and the [Alzheimer's Association Research Roundtable](#). She participates in the Technology Group of the Alzheimer's Association International Society to Advance Alzheimer's Research and Treatment (ISTAART)

After earning an undergraduate degree in biology and religious studies at the University of Virginia, Dr. Snyder moved on to graduate and postgraduate studies in Chicago, completing her Ph.D. at Loyola University Stritch School of Medicine and a postdoctoral fellowship in the neurobiology program at Children's Memorial Research Center of Northwestern University.
