## **Fund Alzheimer's Grants for Respite**

#### WHAT:

Funds provide critical respite care assistance to eligible family caregivers across Missouri.

70% of people with Alzheimer's are living at home with family support. Families can not do it alone.

\$450,000 in the Budget for Department of Health & Senior Services

#### WHO:

Respite care assistance provides up to \$500/year for respite support or care-related products to families caring for a loved one with Alzheimer's at home.

Caregivers provide \$4.2 billion of uncompensated care, much of which would otherwise be provided in nursing homes and funded by Medicaid.

#### WHY:

Alzheimer's disease is the 6th leading cause of death and has no cure.

The disease trajectory is lengthy, spanning 8-20 years following diagnosis. Individuals require steadily increasing assistance with all activities of daily living.

The care demands exact a terrible toll on caregivers – physically, mentally and financially.

### **Fiscal Impact of Alzheimer's Grants:**

99% of respite recipients state that respite helped them care for their loved one at home longer.

Missouri HealthNet spends more than \$158 million annually caring for people with Alzheimer's in nursing homes.

If nursing home placement was delayed by one month for 800 people in the respite program, the state could save more than \$2 million in Medicaid nursing home costs.
