### The Alzheimer's Caregiver Respite Program provides families short-term assistance to arrange paid care.

Whether used for in-home care, adult day services or a shortterm facility stay, respite helps caregivers be "off the clock," supporting their mental, emotional and physical health.

## In SC, an estimated **295,000 unpaid caregivers** currently provide **336 million hours** of care valued at over **\$4 billion**. Respite helps them take a break from round-the-clock care.

**Alzheimer's poses a unique challenge to family caregivers** as the individual with dementia progresses through memory loss, mood and behavior changes, problems with rational thinking and difficulty speaking, swallowing and walking.

# Investing in Alzheimer's Caregiver Respite Makes Sense.

**Please continue funding Alzheimer's Caregiver Respite through the Dept. of Mental Health.** The budget request of **\$778,706** has passed through House Ways & Means Medical Subcommittee.




**Unpaid family caregivers are the first line of defense** before higher and **more costly levels of care** are needed. Supporting their well-being can help avoid or postpone strain on the state budget as families turn to Medicaid long term care.

Over the next 10 years, SC is expected to see a 61% increase in Medicaid costs for Alzheimer's patients, up from \$510 million in 2015. This projected increase is the 6th highest in the nation!

### **19x more**

A senior (65+) with Alzheimer's disease currently costs Medicaid **19 times more** than a senior without dementia.



**81,000** South Carolinians are living with Alzheimer's, and that number is expected to grow to **100,000 by 2025**. In the face of a growing need for respite, it is vitally important to sustain (if not increase) funding levels for the Alzheimer's Caregiver Respite Program.
