III. NIPIA Achievements

The NIPIA is a group within ISTAART and the Alzheimer's Association dedicated to the scientific interchange of ideas among ISTAART members who have interest in brain imaging.

This year, the Committee:

- a. Applied changes in the AIC program (special plenary session reviewing what is new in the neuroimaging of Alzheimer's disease over the last year, walking tour of selected posters and a special symposium focused on more novel or under-represented areas of neuroimaging research).
- b. Submitted a Featured Research Session to AAIC 2015 that was accepted (Suspected Non-Alzheimer's Disease Pathophysiology (SNAP): Clinical Spectrum and Possible Etiologies).
- c. Organized a half-day Education workshop preconference (Norman Foster, Lorna Harper, Victor Villemagne)
- d. Published a Newsletter

IV. NIPIA goals and plans for 2016

- a. Education workshop: have a full-day Education workshop; promote interactions
- b. Preconference day:
 - i. Keep the "What have we learned over the last year" plenary; ask Michel Grothe to suggest candidates for next year to give this talk.

- ii. General: Shorter talks with more time for Q&A.
- iii. Plenaries: 1) What have we learned over last year; 2) Animal imaging (Bedde); 3) Clinical trials; Q&A at the end of the plenaries.
- c. Oral presentations: solicit specific themes: Animal imaging, clinical trials biomarker validation, imaging genetics, and protective factors.
- d. Poster tour: 8 of them, 5 min per poster with Q&A → pick the young investigators who didn't get a talk during the week; have to decide when we will do it; candidates for the prize?; need for a microphone.
- e. AIC: Submit Trans-PIA FRS (clinical trial, SCD, etc)
- f. Special issue of A&D: Diagnosis, Assessment & Disease Monitoring (Liana)
