PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

10 WARNING SIGNS OF ALZHEIMER'S

Join us to learn about 10 common warning signs of Alzheimer's disease and what to watch for in yourself and others.

UNDERSTANDING ALZHEIMER'S AND DEMENTIA

Learn basic information on the difference between Alzheimer's and dementia, stages, risk factors, research and FDA-approved treatments.

EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION STRATEGIES

Teaches caregivers to decode verbal and behavioral communication by someone with Alzheimer's and other dementias.

SUPPORTING INDEPENDENCE

This program focuses on helping the person living with dementia take part in daily activities. It will also explain how to provide the right amount of support and balance safety and independence while managing expectations.

RESPONDING TO DEMENTIA RELATED BEHAVIOR

Understand common behavior changes and how they are a form of communication. Additionally, this program will provide non-medical approaches to behaviors and how to recognize when additional help is needed.

COMMUNICATING EFFECTIVELY

Learn how dementia affects communication. Additionally, receive tips for communicating well with family, friends and health care professionals.

DEMENTIA CONVERSATIONS

This program provides tips for breaking the ice and addressing some of the most important issues to discuss when faced with a loved one believed to have dementia. Issues include, going to the doctor, deciding when to stop driving and making legal and financial plans for future care.

HEALTHY LIVING FOR YOUR BRAIN AND BODY

Join us to learn about research in the areas of diet and nutrition, exercise, cognitive activity and social engagement, and use hands-on tools to help you incorporate these recommendations into a plan for healthy aging.
