FAQs

What time and where does the event start?

Registration "Walker Check-In" & Activities Open: 8:30 am

Remembrance Ceremony: 10:00 am

Start your walk! 10:30 am

How long is the Walk?

3.5 Miles

What happens if it rains?

The Walk is a rain or shine event. However, in the event of severe weather, we will cancel. If this is the case, we will update our [Walk homepage](#) on or before the morning of the event.

Is there water and food available?

There is water available at two water stop along the route. An assortment of donated food and beverage items will be available in the "Food Area" before and after the Walk.

Are dogs/pets allowed on the route?

We love our furry friends, but for the safety of all attendees, pets are **NOT** allowed.

Are strollers, bicycles and skates allowed on Walk day?

We do allow strollers, but for everyone's safety, we discourage bicycles, skateboards, inline skates and wheelie footwear.

Is the Walk route wheelchair friendly?

Yes, however the route does have a hill decline / incline at Burncoat High School.

My loved one is lost, where can I find him/her?

If you are looking for a lost or missing person, please report to the Care and Support to notify the staff. If a lost person identifies themselves to you, please notify a staff member and bring them to the Care and Support tent to be re-united with their party.

What activities will be there on Walk day?

We will have a bunch of Walk day entertainment including kids activities, team photos, vendor exhibits, and Alzheimer's Association information tables. All will open at 8:30 am and be available until the event concludes.

Where are the restrooms?

There will be porto-potties located to the right of the Walk site entrance from the parking lot. We do have ADA accessible toilets available as well as a porto-pottie at the water stop along the Walk route.

REGISTRATION RELATED QUESTIONS

Can I sign up for the Walk at the Walk?

Yes. Visit "Walker Check-In" tent. There is no registration fee or minimum fundraising amount to walk, we do encourage all participants to fundraise to support Alzheimer's care, support and research.

Can I turn in donations at the Walk?

Yes. You can turn in donations on Walk day at the Walker Check-in tent. You can also during in donations in advance by mailing them to our office:

You may also turn in donations by attending our Early Bird Registration night on Tuesday, September 10 at 100 North Parkway in Worcester between 8:00 am – 4:30 pm.

Do I get a Walk T-shirt?

T-shirts are available for all participants who have registered AND raised at least \$150.00 individually. You may claim your t-shirt on Walk day at the Walker Check-in if you qualify. All Walk day volunteers will be provided with a volunteer t-shirt during setup.

How do I get a Promise Flower?

You must be a registered participant to receive a Promise Flower. You'll receive a wristband at Walker Check-in. Each registered participant with a wristband will receive a Promise Flower at the Promise Garden tent. You'll choose the color that best represents your connection to the disease.

What do I do with my Promise Flower?

Before you begin walking, you'll plant your Promise Flower in the Promise Garden. Take note (or a picture!) of where you planted it so you can collect it before you leave.
